## vision statement

Miriam Kim, Westminster Theological Seminary

Our World: there are a little over 6 billion people in the world: 10% evangelical Christians, 25% Christians, 65% unbelievers

-40% are within reach of the church, 25% have no chance

Where do we fit into this?

- -Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-24)
- -"All nations" (Ta ethne) = ethnic; Many pockets of ethnicities within a nation
- -10 and 40 degree latitude from equator; majority of 65% of unbelievers live in this area; only 5% of missionaries are in the 10/40 window

Where is Missions in the Bible?

- -Promise in Genesis 12:3; promise fulfilled in Revelation 5:9—cover to cover
- -32,000 verses that refer to missions

The Goal

- -To reach every people group 10,000 unreached people groups
- -Matthew 28:18-20: we are to baptize and teach, start or plant a church

Is this possible?

- -For every people group, there are 600 evangelical churches; if 5 people from every church got together and became long term workers, we could reach the 65% within a decade
- -The harvest is plenty but the workers are few

Missions is really simple. It's a job that He's given us to do. We must do everything we can to either go or send or pray or mobilize.

Central Asia (Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan, Turkmenistan, Tajikistan, Afghanistan)
-Not much attention from the West; part of the former Soviet Union rule; haven't been opened up until 1991

#### Kyrgyzstan

- -Facts
- --Poorest and smallest of the Central Asian Republics
- --- Capital: Bishkek
- ---Population of 4.7 million
- --Culturally Muslim country; in reality very few people identify to Islam as their own religion
- --An estimated 90% of the population live in poverty
- ---Average income per person per year is \$360, which is 1% of the average US citizen
- -Religion
- -- Muslim 78%, nonreligious 13%, Christian 7%
- --In 1990, there were only 20 believers and now there are at least 3,200

#### Kazakhstan

- -Facts
- -- North of Kyrgyzstan
- --9th biggest country in the world
- ---Half the size of USA
- ---Capital: Astana
- ---Population of 16.8 million
- --Average income per person is \$1.350, which is 4.3% of the average US citizen
- --Polluted with salt and toxic waste
- --- Used by the Soviet as a land to grow wheat
- ---Nuclear fallout affected over 40 million people (one of the biggest testing areas for the former Soviet Union, even to this day they are being affected by nuclear waste)
- --Call themselves Muslim but don't strictly follow Islam; gets mixed up with their religion
- -Religion
- --Muslim 60.5%, Christian 25%
- --10 years ago, there were hardly any Christians in Kazakhstan—now there are more than 6,000; it is the hub for Christian activities in Central Asia

#### Challenges of Going

- -Barriers to accepting Christ
- --Threat to their ethnic "Muslim" identity; they love to hear the Gospel, because it is so freeing for them; but when they want to accept Christ, the statement they make to their family, country, and people, is that they are turning away from their ethnicity and people—they feel like they are betraying their country when they accept Christ; identity as Muslim is hard to be reconciled to Christianity
- --Family pressure; threat to identity
- --Islam is close enough to Christianity; why risk loss of family if my beliefs are close enough?
- ---View Christianity as the religion of the Russian oppressors
- -Needs
- --Church planting in schools/universities, large cities, towns and population centers where there are no churches currently --Begin ministry to reach many unreached people groups: Tatar, Uighur, Azerbaijani, Dungan, Kurd, Gypsy, Chechen, and Turkish people groups
- -Praise the LORD!
- --66 new churches and 315 new outreach groups were started for the past 3 years; many are started from short term teams
- $\hbox{--Increasing \# of missionaries into the countries, increasing printing of New Testaments in respective local languages}$

#### LETTER TO KCCE

KCCE will be sending a short-term mission team of fourteen members to Venezuela over spring break. From the beginning, we saw that it was not us, but God who brought this team together and prepared each of our hearts to be used on the mission field. Individually, we would have been so inadequate in every way to serve God in Venezuela. How could we change lives with our own abilities? God showed us that this was impossible. Only He can change lives and save souls, and we are merely the tools that he chooses to use. With this humbling realization, we devoted a semester full of prayer meetings and training sessions.

We are flying down to Maracaibo, Venezuela on March 17th and will be returning on March 25th. This missions trip is heavily ministry-based. We will visit villages around Maracaibo and evangelize to the locals through songs, mimes, VBS, and the four spiritual laws. A typical day might begin with preparing our hearts for the day ahead. In the morning we will have devotional time and prayer. Then, we will head out to a neighboring village or town singing Spanish praise songs to draw attention. We will use our mimes and the four spiritual laws to share the gospel with the Venezuelans. We are also planning to have VBS for the children of Venezuela. Of course, this is just the plan we have in our heads. Who knows how God might choose to use us once we are there!

Pastor John gave us this advice: "Expect great things from God; attempt great things for God." Our team does not expect to single-handedly lead masses to Christ through our actions alone. We expect that God will work miraculously in the lives of the Venezuelans, in one way or another. Our team, with a broken and humble attitude, may be one way God chooses to work in Venezuela! We have great expectations that God will move powerfully in Maracaibo, so we will depend completely on Him and not on our own strength.

Please keep us in your prayers as the day of our departure approaches. Pray for the people of Venezuela, that God would soften their hearts and allow the Message to work in their lives. Pray for the health of our team, for our unity, and for our safety. Also pray that we would not judge how "well" we did on the mission field by how many people we bring to Christ, but that we would rejoice in each and every life that has been changed, no matter how big or small the number.



#### LETTER TO KCCE

"What about in the trash? Anything in there?" For a moment I didn't know how to respond. Did he really just ask me that? "Um, yeah, sure, probably," I blurted out, trying to hide the surprise in my voice. A minute later I found myself digging through a public trash can looking for a plastic bottle. I found one that looked pretty clean, rinsed it out and filled it with some lemonade, and handed it to the man lying on the bench a few yards away. "This is great!" the man exclaimed when I handed the newly-filled bottle to him. "Great! Thanks a lot, man."

A homeless man just thanked me for giving him a bottle I found in the trash that I had filled with some bad lemonade. That dirty, used bottle of lemonade meant a lot to that man on the bench. And maybe while he and I were trying to find a bottle for him to use he felt like he had someone on his side, and just maybe that meant

In about a week, ten students from Cornell University will be driving a few hours south to live in the ghetto of Kensington, Philadelphia, for a week and meet the needs of the urban poor in the area. They won't have much to give besides a box full of socks and Bibles, a few sandwiches and hotdogs, maybe a thermos of lemonade or two. But neither did the little boy who brought Jesus his two fish and five loaves. In Jesus' hands, that meager lunch was used to show that the Kingdom of God, a Kingdom with no pain, fear, or tears, had arrived. "The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by hands. And he is not served by human hands, as if he needed anything, because he himself gives all men life and breath and everything else. From one man he made every nation of men, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he determined the times set for them and the exact places where they should live. God did this so that men would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from each one of us. 'For in him we live and move and have our being.'" -Acts 17:24-28

As the world's largest democracy and second most populous country, India has made vast improvements since gaining its independence from Britain in 1947. Already, great strides have been made towards an improved standard of living.

Despite these advancements, the vast majority of the population remains illiterate and impoverished. Although their government professes a democratic creed, those of the lower castes are still dominated by the ancient Hindu caste system, chained to a fixed place in the social hierarchy. However, more than economic or political disadvantage, these people suffer the greatest poverty of all—rejection, ostracism, the feeling of being unwanted. They are despised by men, deprived of love.

For a country whose motto is "Truth will prevail," the Truth in India has been recently persecuted at a violent and unprecedented rate. K.P. Yohanan, founder of Gospel for Asia, a missionary foundation in India, says, "We are facing more persecution now than at any other time in our history. Our leaders on the mission field tell me that it has become such a regular, daily event that they now report only the worst cases."

According to Yohanan, a growing Hindu supremacist ideology, Hindutya, literally meaning "Hindu-ness," has possessed the government with the goal of a purely Hindu nation with a dogma that declares, "To be Indian is to be Hindu." The Dalits ("Untouchables") and other lower classes of the caste system are the most greatly affected by this ideology, as extremist minority groups attempt to gain control over them. How does this seemingly political issue relate to the persecution of Christians? As stated by Yohanan,

"Because, just like in England and America in centuries past, believers in Jesus are the ones today working and praying toward the liberation of millions of 'slaves' on the Indian subcontinent. These slaves—the Dalits and other lower classes—make up the vast majority of the Indian population. Yet they are the ones harassed, abused, denied the right to worship, forced to live on the outskirts of villages, maltreated and even murdered—simply because of their social position...the issue is not a primarily religious one, although proponents of Hindutva would lead the public to believe so. No, the issue here is much more sinister; it exposes the dark side of human nature. And while there are many other issues and variables involved in the struggle for spiritual freedom, this is a significant one that deserves much attention and prayer."

attacked with iron rods, and believers have been framed for murder. To our brothers and sisters in India, we lift up this prayer to them, believing Christ when he says,

"Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you" (Matthew 5:11-12)

"Dear friends, do not be surprised at the painful trial you are suffering, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice that you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when his glory is revealed. If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you...if you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God that you bear that name...So then, those who suffer according to God's will should commit themselves to their faithful Creator and continue to do good." (I Peter 4:12-19)

Just so, if we are indeed His Body, let us remember that "If one part suffers, every part suffers with it" (I Corinthians 12:26)

Let us remember our Lord Jesus Christ, the One we follow and raise up, who suffered willingly, lovingly, in obedience for the salvation of the world, who was Himself "despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering." (Isaiah 53:3)

In a last word from K.P. Yohanan, "As we grow in our understanding of the issues behind this persecution, we must also understand our responsibility in this situation as Christians. We must be willing to give of ourselves through prayer and fasting until we see a breakthrough. We must be willing to 'dig in our heels' and not give up. And through our sacrifice and willingness to identify with our suffering and oppressed brothers and sisters in Asia, I am convinced we will someday have the joyful privilege to welcome millions of men, women and children into heaven. The blessings we will experience then will be far greater than any discomfort or inconvenience now."

We cry out to the Lord, "Why should the nations say, 'Where is their God?' Before our eyes, make known among the nations that you avenge the outpoured blood of your servants" (Psalm 79:10)

And He replies, "'Listen to me, my people; hear me, my nation: The law will go out from me; my justice will become a light to the nations" (Isaiah 51:4)

We rest assured – the Truth will indeed prevail in God's nation, India.

## {blessed are you

It is not new to us that the church in Paul's day, and even before that, endured "persecution." In fact, if one refers back to Acts 7, it was he who stood there watching the martyr Stephen be stoned to death. Throughout Paul's years of ministry, he continued to rejoice in suffering for the growing church across Asia Minor.

It should not surprise us, then, that the present church is going through the same thing. There have been dozens of instances even in just the past six months, of physical violence and legal action taken against Christians in countries such as India, Pakistan, Nigeria, Indonesia. The stories of Brother Yun in China have reached many through The Heavenly Man, and there are countless stories of the treatment of Christians in North Korea. And yet here we are in the comfortable US of A. There may not be persecution as directly as mentioned, but contemplating Jesus' words in John 15:18-20, it is natural, if we are truly following Christ.

"If the world hates you, keep in mind it hated me first. If you belonged to the world, it would love you as its own. As it is, you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world. That is why the world hates you. Remember the words I spoke to you: 'No servant is greater than his master.' If they persecuted me, they will persecute you also."

But Jesus also said, "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me," in Matthew 5:11; thus, we have hope in the promises of God! As part of the entire body of Christ, let us encourage the unified church that reaches even to the corners of the jailed missionary in India, the beaten distributor of Christian literature in Pakistan, lifting one another up in prayer, crying out for His mercies, and enjoying in His glory.
